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### **West Indians and their Language**

Article 343 of the Indian constitution stated that the official language of the Union is Hindi in Devanagari script instead of the extant English. Later, a constitutional amendment, The Official Languages Act, 1963, allowed for the continuation of English alongside Hindi in the Indian government indefinitely until legislation decides to change it.

Peter A. Roberts gives another definition of the term in his book *West Indians and Their Language*. He argues that Creole languages are “the result of the contact between English, French, Spanish, Portuguese, Dutch (‘languages of the colonising people’) and West African languages (‘languages of a colonised people’)” 2.

The English language is the third most established throughout the Caribbean; however, due to the relatively small populations of the English-speaking territories, only 14% of West Indians are English speakers.
